



SF-182 Byrne & Associates Introduction to The Native American Schools Writing Project

Synopsis:

This one day Introduction to the Native American Schools Writing Project (NASWP) will provide teachers with a “taste” of what the entire NASWP will be. Teachers will examine how the Common Core State Standards impact writing and what constitutes best practices in writing. They will participate in actual writing lessons, have time to write and share their work with a small group, and plan a writing lesson that they can use in their own classrooms.

Target Audience:

K-12 Teachers, Literacy Coaches

Goals:

- ☐ To provide participants with information about the CCSS that relate to writing.
- ☐ To provide participants with information on best practices in teaching writing.
- ☐ To provide opportunities for participants to write for themselves.
- ☐ To provide opportunities for participants to experience as students the writing workshop.
- ☐ To provide participants with opportunities to apply new learning to their own classroom instruction.

Outcomes:

- ☐ Review the parts of the CCSS that relate to writing.
- ☐ Read and discuss research on best practices in teaching writing.
- ☐ Experience a writing workshop, which includes a focused lesson, modeled writing, independent write time, response groups, and reflection.
- ☐ Work in small groups to develop writing lessons for individual classrooms.

Costs:

Cost for this one-day introduction to the CCSS-referenced writing process is \$1200.
Total travel costs are \$808. (airfare \$300.; hotel, \$298, plus taxes; per diem \$165.; airport parking, \$30.; mileage to/from airport \$15.)
Materials cost is \$375. (\$15. per participant, for a total of 25 participants)
Total cost for training is \$2383.
